Brief Summary report (Translated) on three-day orientation program for newly admitted students at Dev Sanskriti Vishwavidyalaya (DSVV) in Haridwar, India, held from July 23-25, 2024. Day 1: July 23, 2024

- 9. Campus Discipline and Code of Conduct: Dr. Ashwini Sharma explained the university's rules and expectations.
- 10. Security Briefing: Dr. Arunesh Parashar outlined safety measures and restricted areas.
- 11. Introduction to NCC (National Cadet Corps): Mr. Pawan Rajoria explained the benefits of joining NCC.
