

# PRO VICE CHANCELLOR EUROPE VISIT

Pro-Vice-Chancellor of Dev Sanskriti Vishwavidyalaya, Honourable Dr. Chinmay Pandya Ji, during his stay in Europe, met Mrs Patricia Scotland. She is a British diplomat, barrister, politician and working as the sixth Secretary-General of the Commonwealth of Nations.

In the course of the meeting, on one hand, the relief efforts made during the period of the COVID pandemic were shared by the representative of All World Gayatri Pariwar, while on the other

hand, Dev Sanskriti Vishwavidyalaya and the Commonwealth Association jointly determined to work in various fields, in which the action plan related to the subjects like faith-based education, faith-based leadership and establishment of Commonwealth Leadership Academy was also given a new dimension.

Mrs Patricia Scotland is the first female Secretary-General of the Scottish Commonwealth of Nations and a belief-based

methodology is central to her achievements. In 2007, she was given the position of Attorney General by the Prime Minister of Britain, which no other woman has received before.

She was also appointed as the Chief Legal Adviser to the Queen of Britain. She has also served as Britain's Home Minister and is also the first and only person in the history of Britain to receive 5 Parliamentary Awards.

To further advance the research on Yagya, Yagyavalkya Center for Yagya Research at DSVV has organised a Symposium among scientists from 4 IITs , NEERI-Nagpur, NPL-CSIR, and many others. The symposium discussion has an impacting potential for next-generation interdisciplinary research work in the field of Yagya.

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

# Mother tongue the soul of expression

*In the words of M. Venkaiah Naidu, Hon. Vice President, India*

Recently Hon. Vice President of India, M. Venkaiah Naidu Ji visited Dev Sanskriti Vishwavidyalaya. During this visit, he inaugurated the South Asian Institute for Peace and Reconciliation. Mr. Naidu stated after the inauguration that South Asian countries share common history and civilisation, he also called for respecting the linguistic, ethnic and cultural diversities in the region, which showcase the core values of tolerance and peaceful coexistence.

During the inaugural ceremony of this institute, Hon. Vice President of India praised the University for its Gurukul-type system of community living which is devoted to holistic education by combining practical knowledge (Shiksha) with spiritual education

(Vidya) and seeks to provide a Holistic learning experience to every student. Mr. Naidu said University is unique in itself for building character, developing competence and promoting culture in students and binds the students to the roots of our Indian Culture.

During his discourse, he emphasised the use of Mother tongue for preserving our extraordinary and cultural diversity of India. He said Mother, Mother tongue, Mother land and Guru they all are very important and we must respect them.

Stressing the importance of mother tongue in our lives, the Vice President exhorted the youth to practice, propagate and promote their mother tongues.

He said, "Our heritage, culture and forefathers should bring us

pride. We should go back to our roots and let go of our colonial mentality. We must teach our children to take pride in their Indian identity and learn as many Indian languages as we can. We must cherish our mother tongue."

"I would like to see a day when Indians talk to their fellow countrymen in their mother tongue, administration is run in mother tongue and all government orders are issued in people's language," Naidu said. He also called for use of local languages in court proceedings.

He encouraged students to propagate their mother tongue and said, "I look forward to the day when every state's gazette notice will be in its mother tongue." Your mother tongue is like your eyesight, whereas your knowledge

of a foreign language is like your spectacles."

Further he said, Foreign dignitaries coming to India speak in their mother tongue instead of English despite knowing it because they take pride in their own language.

Hon Vice President said, "Sanskrit is a great language and we must learn Sanskrit to know our scriptures, which are a treasure trove of knowledge."

Fortunately Sanskrit is interconnected with many of our Indian languages. We should translate its words in our respective mother tongues so that it becomes easy to catch.

The mother tongue lays a strong foundation for the expression of creativity. Every effort must be made to nurture creativity at the formative stage. He said that he is very glad that the National Education Policy, 2020 is stressing upon the need to learn our mother tongue.

A number of studies undertaken by various expert organisations throughout the world

have found that teaching the mother language in the early stages of education stimulates the development of the mind and thought, making children more creative and rational.

Language is a means of expressing one's thoughts and feelings. It is a channel for the transmission of culture, scientific knowledge, and a worldview from one generation to the next. It is the important, hidden link that binds the past and present together. It evolves with human development and is nurtured by frequent use. In short, our languages pervade every aspect of our daily lives and serve as the foundation for our society. They are, in reality, the lifeblood of our individual and social identities. They have an important role in forming and strengthening human ties.

We must treat persons who speak, write, and communicate in these languages with dignity and pride. We must promote Indian language magazines, publications, and children's books. The importance of dialects and folk

literature cannot be overstated. Language should serve as a catalyst for growth that is inclusive. Promotion of languages should be an inherent aspect of effective administration. According to Swami Vivekananda, Language is the primary means and indicator of a nation's advancement.

The Vice President emphasised the necessity of preserving and protecting our cultural legacy. He said, "We can't afford to lose the treasure we've inherited, the reservoir of our collective knowledge and wisdom accumulated over the course of our long civilisation journey.

When a language dies then it leaves behind a complete knowledge system and a unique way of looking at the world. Traditional lifestyle patterns, as well as our unique talents, arts, crafts, cuisine, and trade, vanish with the decline of a language.

The mother tongue is the soul of expression. Let's nurture our mother tongue. Let creativity flourish in full bloom.





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
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
