Celebrating Holi at DSVV

We often hear that Holi is the festival of colors, Holi is the festival of liveliness but it is extremely vital to understand that Holi is a lot more than throwing water balloons at each other and playing with color. One must understand that each and every festival which is celebrated in the Indian culture has a message and includes improving both the external and eternal aspects of mankind. Pujya Gurudev Pt. Shri Ram Sharma Acharya had said that "The message of Holi is to find out and clean the inner and outer dirt and establish four-dimensional purity and the right way to celebrate Holi is to find and burn all the thorns, all the obstructions which come in our way and all the perverted mental, social and political thoughts"

He clearly hints that Holi is a fine day, a fine opportunity to do both inner and outer cleansing. Earlier, people used to gather in numbers on Holi and gathered collectively unwanted garbage and unkempt buds lying on the streets and then celebrate the festival by burning them. Cleansing of drains, pits, sludge, dust etc was also done. The dirt was removed from its roots, in such a manner that even the frozen dirt gets cleaned. It is necessary to clean the and create an atmosphere of cleanliness. Otherwise, along with seasonal changes in the field, this mess can get distorted form by promoting diseases like smallpox.

we have with our friends, relatives and closed ones. It is a great day opportunity to put a full stop to all the negative vibes that we send to others and pray for the good of all because we belong to a culture which has accepted even its invaders and enemies.

It also inspires us with the message of equality. It teaches us that unity and affinity should be adopted while removing the distinction of discrimination. Holi is the festival of parity but it is our sheer misfortune that today that gender, race, money, property and other various so call status symbols are used to judge the greatness of a man. Infact it should virtues, deeds and nature and not gender or race which decide the high or low state of a man in society. According to Pujya gurudev in reality no one is really high or low but he has always given the message that every person should believe that he/she is the most person of this world.

Disappointing news stories of women being molested on the name of Holi and asking not to feel bad just because it is Holi are doing rounds regularly in the media. People have crossed all-limits and it is raising question on the existence of the festival but it is nothing more than needless modifications of the festival which people do.

It is high time that we return to our origin and unlock our potential and realize that we are sons of highly spiritually elevated rishi satta.
